During this two day course, you will complete a pair of leather moccasins with inner padding or sheepskin lining, with or without a top. You will learn about leather, the various terms and history; you will become familiar with the few basic hand tools used to create; you will learn how to look at your feet as forms to be fitted and you will learn how to make a pattern, based on traditional native American gathered toe designs, to fit your feet, or the feet of family and friends, including children. Once you have acquired this fundamental human skill, you will discover that you can not only create and repair footwear at a fraction of today's cost, but you will gain the confidence to make anything you need.
